New Items for Yap Day 2015

A. Municipal Parade will include recognition of Chiefs and Historical billboard presentation.

The parade will be led by the municipal chief. The billboard will be carried behind the chief, and the chief's community/school will follow. The chief will be recognized during the parade. The historical billboard will be presented and displayed after the parade. The billboard should depict a cultural legend or custom of Yap that may be specific to the municipality, which carries it in the parade. (Each municipality will be provided some materials needed for their billboard by the Tamil Yap Day Core group.) The three most organized municipalities will be awarded. The host community will not be included in the competition. The awards will be as following:

B. Tuba cutting/tasting and demonstration.

There will be two coconut trees designated at the site to be used for the demonstration. One will be used to show how the tuba is cut. The other will be used to give out "samples" of the tuba. Samples to be given out may include both types of tuba.

C. Mil garup to be included in the Municipality Relay.

The first leg will be the male participants climbing the betel-nut tree and retrieving the betelnut. The second leg will be the female participants weaving a basket. The third leg will be the second male husking the copra. The fourth leg, after the baskets have been loaded, will be a young boy/girl running to the finish line using the mil garup.

D. Yap State Chamber of Commerce Booths.

These booths will be located on the upper field, on the far west side of the Yap Day Site, lining the cliff and facing towards the back of both community houses. These vendors will include all the members of the Chamber of Commerce. This is a promotion for our local businesses to showcase and promote their products that are made of local materials, such as handicrafts, furniture, nursery products, grass skirts, coconut oil, any kind of products that are made locally and made of local materials. They may also sell food in their booths so long they are local food and produce only. They are allowed to sell alcohol if one of those vendors promoted alcohol that that is made locally, i.e. tuba, brewer beer made of local produce, etc. After the 2-day celebration, the top three vendors will receive awards.

E. Additional Municipal skit.

There will be another skit or two from any municipality reflecting something of our culture or a legend. The skit on the second day will be from the host community to showcase traditional tattoo along with all traditional attire and custom relating to the skit.

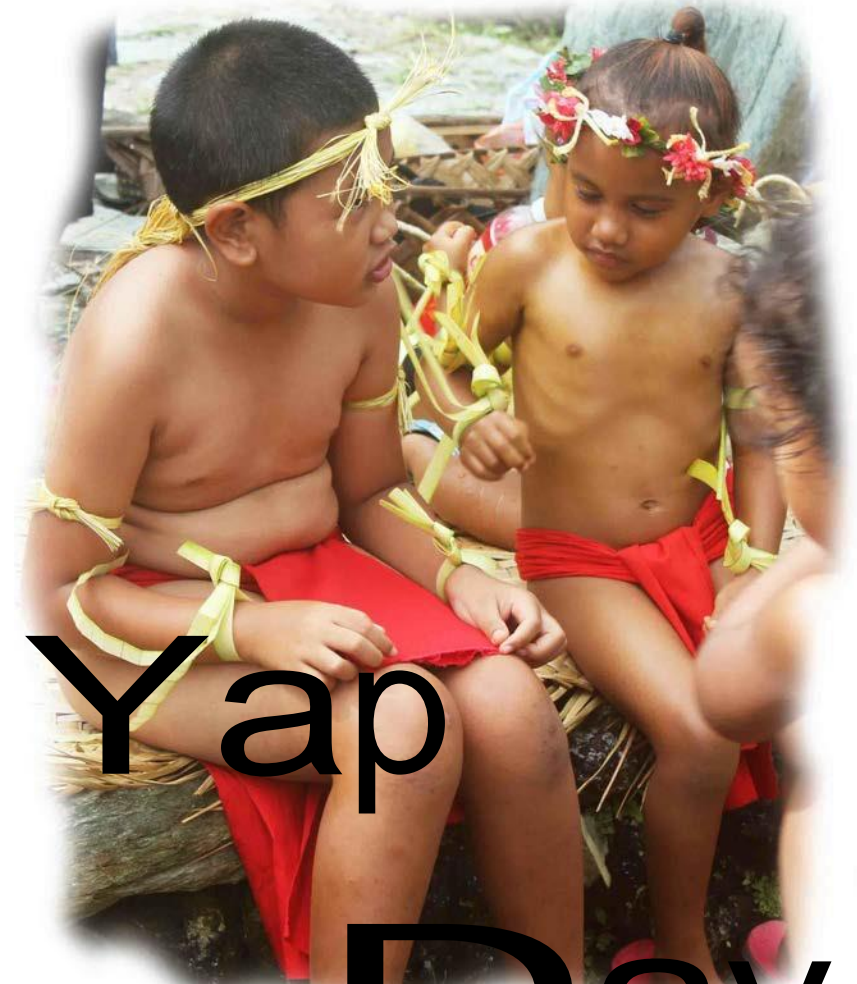
F. Gaan e arche' and m'og machaf will be done on selected dance(s) by Municipal Chief.

The items to be used for gaan e arche' will be only traditional local goods, such as fruits, lava lava, etc. In addition, some of the local items to be presented as gifts to the off-island Palau Delegation present there on that day. Palau delegation is more than welcome to join in the presentation or gaan e arche'.

G. Yap Chamber of Commerce Award

At the end of the second day, three vendors will receive awards for being best in show, well organized, having various products, and the presentation and set-up of their booth. They will be awarded the following:
